MEDICAL STAFF

Providers: We have a new dental director- Dr. Ryan Huang will assume the responsibility once he signs his contract.

We had three providers leave in the month January. We are in the process of recruiting new providers.

We have hired a new physician – Dr. Kristin Woolley. In the meantime, we are short-staffed and will attempt to keep access to patients by using locum tenens.

Provider Meetings: Had trainings on Minors and Reproductive Services – Consents and Confidentiality. The training was lead by Paula McAlpin. This training will also be extended to LVN's, Front desk staff, Referral coordinators and Patient Navigators.
